Called to Be Different

But I say to you who hear, love your enemies, do good to those you hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.



Luke 6:27-28 ESV (Monthly Watchword for January 2025)

Back in 1983, Concordia Publishing House of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) produced a short film about the early career of Martin Luther in honor of the five-hundredth anniversary of his birth. This film is well-produced and historically accurate, and I share it with my confirmation students each year. It is called *Martin Luther: Heretic*, and it can be found on YouTube for anyone interested.

One scene showed an interaction between Martin Luther and his students. Luther had just experienced his theological "breakthrough," where he understood that people are saved by God's grace through faith rather than through their righteous works. He pointed out that people of faith do good works not to prove or gain anything, but just because that is how they are and who they are called to be. Christians live before God by faith, trust in God's gift to them. One student objected: "It can't be that easy." But Luther responded: "You think faith is easy?"

If we read the words of Jesus and take them seriously, we realize that the life to which he calls us is not easy. We don't earn our status before God, but when we live in relationship with God, we come to see God's grace as a life-changing reality. We learn to question our assumptions, our actions, and our desires. We learn to say, "*Thy* will be done" rather than "*My* will be done." When we say those words in the Lord's Prayer either corporately or privately, at least I don't always take to heart the full meaning of what I am asking.

The monthly Watchword, or theme verse, for January is one such statement from Jesus that challenges our assumptions about life in the world. It goes against everything we feel and are taught. When someone wrongs others but especially wrongs us, we desire justice. We want the "bad guys" to get what they deserve. Finding the energy to pray for others in general is challenging. But here, Jesus wants us to use at least some of that energy to pray for those who harm us.

When it comes to earthly protection and justice, we can be grateful for the systems that God has put in place for the harmony and benefit of creation. In our sinful world, where there are people out to harm others, we need laws and institutions such as police and courts. People involved in such occupations serve an important role in the well-being of the world. The existence of these institutions helps maintain the distinction between right and wrong, and it helps (though doesn't guarantee) accountability for wrongful actions.

But what kind of attitude does God desire to find in us in the process? *Love your enemies, do good to those you hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.* These are hard words to swallow. And yet this is the witness that Christians are called to give to the world. We are indeed called to be different in how we respond to others. Wrongdoers should face earthly justice for their actions, but in the process we do not forget that the wrongdoers are also human beings like us. Like us, they are in the image of God, and like us, they are the objects of God's love. We pray that their eyes might be opened and that they, like us, might experience the love and grace of God, which has the power to change their lives.

How is it possible to love someone who has harmed us? Here it is important to distinguish between "love" and "like." When someone has seriously harmed us, there is a good chance we will never "like" that individual or become close, personal friends with that person. Such is the consequence of sin in the world. But at the very least, we recognize that God's love is for that person as much as it is for us. As much as we rely on God's grace in our lives, we can be gracious enough to pray for their change of heart and that God's blessing would be upon them as they move forward. By our graciousness, we bear witness to the God who has been so gracious to us, especially in the gift of Jesus Christ, our Savior, who is our life and our hope.


