North, South, and Now East!

A man's mind plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps. –
Proverbs 16:9 RSV



How did you end up in Ohio? This is a question I've been asked in various forms over the last few months. Only a few short days ago I was serving as a pastor on the high plains. Now I am in what is for me an unfamiliar part of the country. I have driven through Ohio many times, but until this last summer, I never expected to call it home.

Life is filled with unexpected things, at least in my experience. That's why this verse from Proverbs 16:9 has been meaningful for me over the years: *A man's mind plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps.*

I can't say that I anticipated being called to serve in small-town Ohio. But at the same time, I am not surprised that my life has taken an unexpected turn. For me, most significant things have been unexpected. You just never know what is around the corner, the new adventures to which God calls us.

The title of this, my first newsletter article for Grace Lutheran Church in Thornville, is the same as my last newsletter article for my now former call at Good Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church of Lindy, Nebraska. In that article, I reflected on the different places I have been led, the different people God has placed in my path, and the blessings I have both given and received in the process. As I sit here among unpacked boxes

in the parsonage, I would like to do the same here as a way of introducing myself and my family to you.

I was born and raised in rural Canby, Minnesota, a small town near the South Dakota border, named for a Union Army general in the Civil War (for reasons that remain obscure to me). My dad farmed until I was six and then took a job at the technical college in town. Therefore, I wasn't technically a "farm kid," but I did grow up with corn and soybean fields on three sides of my house.

As odd as it sounds, I have come to expect the unexpected. After high school graduation in 1998, I studied at Augustana College (now University) in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, one of the historic Lutheran colleges in the United States, out of the Norwegian Lutheran tradition. When I was in middle school and early high school, I was probably the last person anyone would have thought would become a pastor. I was fairly cynical about church and didn't think much about faith. But God had other plans, and he drew me back to the promise he had given me when I was baptized as an infant. In ninth grade, I first felt a calling to serve as a pastor and possibly a professor in the future, so I tailored my course of study in preparation for that.

The summers between my college years found me serving as a summer camp counselor for youth at Lutheran church camps in Minnesota, Montana, and North Dakota. I never expected to be a camp counselor, but this experience stretched me in a good way, and I came to love it.

I entered Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota in 2002, which is the historic Norwegian Lutheran seminary. For my required internship in my third year, there were a select number of international internships available. I applied for that, hoping that it would be an opportunity to use the German language I had spent so much time learning in college. I expected to be posted

to the international, English-speaking congregation in Berlin. They sent me instead to a joint site between the St. Thomas Church in Leipzig, the home of the Lutheran church musician Johann Sebastian Bach, and what was called the “Wittenberg Center,” an English-speaking continuing educational center for people desiring to learn more about Martin Luther and the Reformation. Working in a foreign language and unfamiliar culture was challenging, but it was one of the more rewarding experiences of my life.

For a time, I expected to remain single my whole life, thinking this was God’s will for me. That all changed upon my return from Germany when I met Theresa at Luther Seminary, who was in her first year during my last year. After graduation from seminary, I expected to be assigned as a pastor to Montana or North Dakota, my top two choices. I was unexpectedly assigned to northwestern Minnesota. I received a call to serve two small congregations in a quintessential Norwegian town called Gonvick. Serving among the good folks at Samhold and United Lutheran Churches for four years made me more familiar with traditional Norwegian foods like lefse and potato klub (I will leave it to you to research what those are). I also picked up a really thick Norwegian accent, which was also unexpected.

I thought I might be in Gonvick for some time longer, but the opportunity presented itself to pursue further education. Still without children, Theresa and I moved back to St. Paul, Minnesota for me to begin my Ph.D. degree program. After a year and a half on campus for my coursework, Theresa unexpectedly received a call to serve Grace and Our Savior’s Lutheran Churches in Menno, South Dakota.

While still working on finishing my degree from a distance, I unexpectedly received a phone call at the church parsonage from the council president of Good Shepherd Ev. Lutheran Church of Lindy, Nebraska, an hour south of Menno. They were

in a time of transition, and though I wasn’t looking for it, they called me to serve as their pastor, which I did for seven years. I never expected to become a family man with three children. But over the years, Henrik (10), Helena (7), and Antonia (3) have been added to our household and enriched us with their presence.

This brings me to today. In addition to God’s steadfast love in Christ, unexpectedness has been the recurring theme of my life. Therefore, when I encountered Jeff Morlock in the hall at the NALC convocation in Texas this last summer, I remained open when he suggested the possibility of serving at Grace Lutheran in Thornville. Home for us is wherever we make it, and we are glad to be among you, even if we find ourselves on the opposite side of the Midwest from our most recent location. This has been the oddest Christmas I have ever experienced, tying up loose ends in South Dakota and Nebraska while packing boxes. But we are glad finally to get settled and ease into the process of becoming buckeyes!

Over the next few weeks, in conversation with the church council and others, I will begin identifying aspects of congregational life that need attention, such as confirmation instruction, youth events, and the like. It will take some time for us to get acquainted. Therefore, I also hope to hold a series of “cottage gatherings,” simply times of informal gathering held in the homes of various members. More information on this is forthcoming.

You should know that in addition to history, theology, music, Star Trek, Star Wars, and the Lord of the Rings, I love writing newsletter articles for congregations. When I do, I try my best to end with something profound. But as of this point, having been here for only a few days and not even yet officially installed as pastor, the most profound thing I can say is “thank you.”

Thank you for your welcome of me and my family. Thank you for all the work so many have done in preparation for our arrival. Thank you for your patience with me as I struggle to place names with faces and learn the ins and outs of this congregation and community. Most of all, thank you for the many ways that all of you serve the Lord in this congregation and in your daily lives.

As a pastor, I began my ministry far “up north” in Minnesota. I moved further south among Nebraska cattle farmers. Now I have moved east. I am looking forward to beginning this new chapter in the life of Grace Lutheran together with you!

1. Opening Prayer/Call to Order: Prayer was offered and meeting called to order by Council President Paul Moentmann.

2. Upreach/Worship Renewal

- Been in contact with Pastor Jacobson regarding January worship.
- Pastor Phillips' last Sunday is December 26th.
- Looking to engage more greeters and acolytes.
- Engaged a member of the congregation to construct a chalice veil that matches the Holy Week paraments.
- Worship Renewal Task Force
 - The team, along with Rogers/Krajnak Architects (RKA), reviewed qualifications of prospective contractors for pre-construction services and four were selected to move forward in the process.
 - Three contractors toured the church and provided construction estimates based on the schematic design phase.
 - These three contractors were interviewed by the team, along with RKA. One contractor was selected to participate in pre-construction services during the Design Development Phase that begins on 01/04/2022 with RKA, consultants and the contractor for value added engineering.
 - There is no obligation on the part of Grace Lutheran Church to retain this contractor in any actual construction bid process.
 - Pastor Tom Jacobson has been kept informed of the process of the team.

3. Inreach

- There are plans for a pictorial directory.
- There is work started for a Christmas Shadow program for next year.
- Sunday School is working on trying to have classes for various age groups.

4. Treasurer Report

- Financials are in good shape and books are balanced.

5. Old Business

- Worship services will remain the same due to covid-19.
- Pastor Tom Jacobson's first Sunday will be January 2, 2022.
- Installation of council officers will be January 9, 2022.
- Pastor Tom's Installation will be January 23, 2022 at the 10:30 service with a potluck to follow. Depending on any changes in the county concerning covid-19, the potluck could be canceled.

6. New Business

- Seminary in Ethiopia: There are over 60,000 people each month needing help. Offering can be given with a marked envelope.
- Backpack Ministry has received \$10,400 from The Shelly Company.

Church Council Meeting Minutes January 17, 2022 7:00 PM

1. **Opening Devotion and Prayer:** Devotion and prayer was offered by Pastor Tom Jacobson
2. **Call to Order:** Meeting was called to order by Paul Moentmann
3. **Pastor's Report**
 - Pastor Tom thanked everyone at Grace for all the preparations made prior to their arrival.
 - Visits have started to be made to shut-in members.
 - 1st Communion classes will begin soon.
 - Confirmation classes will be starting in February for 8th and 9th grades. Confirmation will take place on Reformation Sunday.
 - Lenten Soup Dinners, with a service, will hopefully take place this year.
 - Cottage gatherings: To help Pastor Tom connect and get to know people, he wants to start small group gatherings of people, to meet at the church or in someone's home who volunteers to host, throughout the first year.
4. **Upreach/Worship Renewal**
 - Installation service will happen on January 23, 2022. Pastor Jeff Morlock, Dean of the Southern Ohio Mission District, will be preaching. Only one service at 10:30 am, followed by a potluck.
 - Worship Renewal Task Force: Setterlin Building Company has investigated some areas of the church building that are concealed by wall or ceiling treatments to determine

additional existing conditions (structural supports within walls, plaster ceiling conditions, floor joists in balcony, sanctuary attic space availability, etc.) to more accurately determine the needs of any construction as part of the Design Development Phase. The Design Development Phase is expected to be completed by the end of April.

5. **Inreach**
 - Adventures in Faith (AIF) has been encouraging kids to invite a friend to help grow our youth. AIF Visitor bags, that consist of pop it bracelets, bubbles and pop rocks, will say "We are so glad you "POPPED" by Grace Lutheran Church's Adventures in Faith class. We hope to see you again soon!"
 - Pastor Tom, Kate Simmons and Amber Feyh met on Saturday, 1/15/22, to make plans for Confirmation to start on February 6th for our catch-up group. We're doing this because there have been some kids who missed being in confirmation due to the pastoral vacancy. For those kids, pastor will go through the curriculum a little faster, and they can have their confirmation service this coming October. Then next fall, pastor will start with a regular two-year program for eighth and ninth graders.
 - First Communion for 3rd and 4th graders will be starting March 27th and will finish May 8th (5-week course).
 - Cake will be arranged after Confirmation and 1st Communion.
 - Sunday Teachers needed, especially for ages 5 and under.
 - Will be reaching out again to some Photo Directory Companies.
6. **Treasurer Report**
 - Financials for the month of December and a summary of the 2021 income and expenses were reviewed.

7. Old Business

- Covid-19 Response: The front pews will continue to be roped off. Face masks and gloves will continue to be worn for communion.
- Picture Directory: Pastor Tom suggested reaching out to Lifetouch, a photography company, to provide Grace with a Photo Directory. Jeni Lahman will also provide an example Photo Directory at her previous church. In the short-term, members of Grace are encouraged to be part of Facebook onto the members page Grace Lutheran Church's website.
- The Backpack Ministry received offerings from both Thanksgiving and Christmas.

8. New Business

- Pastor Jacobson will be going to a Pastor's Conference from 2/15 – 2/17 in Orlando. During his absence, Pastor Theresa Jacobson will be on call.
- Notice of Liquor Permit Application for Firehouse Pizza: Because Firehouse Pizza is under new ownership, Paul Moentmann will be signing off on their liquor permit.
- Property Committee: Council President Paul Moentmann asked Carl Lahman if he would be willing to head up a Property Committee. Carl agreed and council approved.
- Mutual Ministry Committee: Council President Paul Moentmann and Pastor Tom decided it was good idea to create a Mutual Ministry Committee, to serve as a support to Pastor Tom during this transition period at Grace. This committee of 3-4 members will be created soon.
- Introductory Video: Council discussed the possibility of creating a video (with maybe a drone video) to be linked to Grace's website page, as an introduction to Grace, our pastor and our ministries. (Rick Rockwell noted that he knows of a company that can do a drone video.)
- Monthly Calendar events: It was suggested to council that, with the help of Beth Gilgien (Office Manager), other events be added to the Gracevine/Website calendar.

- Activities/Ministries Directory: It was also suggested to council that an updated/new Activities/Ministry Directory be developed.

9. Adjourn: Meeting was concluded with the Lord's Prayer.




