"Here I Raise My Ebenezer"

To this day I have had the help that comes from God, and so I stand here testifying both to small and great.

Acts 26:22 ESV (Monthly Watchword for August 2025)



One of the most popular Christian hymns in the English-speaking world is "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" by Robert Robinson (1735-1790). Though he was a Baptist dissenter from the Church of England, his hymn has had true "staying power" over the last few centuries among Christians of many types.

Its popularity is understandable. The text and tune merge to form a beautiful expression of the Christian faith: the call to recognize our sinful human tendency to wander from God ("prone to wander, Lord, I feel it...bind my wandering heart to thee"), the debt we owe to God because of His goodness to us ("Oh, to grace how great a debtor daily I'm constrained to be"), and the call Christian people have to express their faith with their lives ("Tune my heart to sing thy grace"). I have never grown tired of this hymn in all the years I have sung it.

The one part of his hymn, however, that raises some eyebrows is an odd reference in the second verse: "Here I raise my Ebenezer, hither by thy help I'm come." What is an Ebenezer? I have received this question often when we have sung this hymn in worship in other places, and so I always try to provide an advance explanation, thereby allowing the congregation to sing the hymn with greater meaning. Many of us have heard the name of Ebenezer Scrooge from *A Christmas Carol*, but this reference goes back much farther.

From the book of 1 Samuel in the Old Testament, the word in Hebrew means "stone of help." In chapter 7 of that book, the Israelites had struggled in their battle with the Philistines, and Samuel wanted to remind the people that it was by God's help, God's grace, that they came through their struggle. He therefore set up a stone as a monument in that place.

Speaking only for myself, though I am guessing it is true for most anyone, I often fail to reflect on the ways that God has helped me. Especially in our country, we are taught the values of personal responsibility, hard work, and achievement. On a certain level, it is not wrong to take pride in our accomplishments. But proper perspective is important. A 1998 Survey of Lutheran Beliefs and Practices conducted by Lutheran Brotherhood (one of the predecessors of Thrivent Financial) tried to "take the temperature" of Lutherans in the United States by asking questions about how they understand their faith. It revealed, among other things, something disturbing: 44% disagreed with the following statement: "Property (house, car, money, etc.) belongs to God and we only hold it in trust for God." Really? Who is it that gave us the ability to acquire those things?

A foundational aspect of Christian faith is that God is indeed the "Fount of Every Blessing." We are who we are by the grace of God. This includes not only what we need physically from day to day. It includes also our spiritual life. God provides us with the Bread of Life, Jesus Christ our Lord, who is our life and salvation.

In this month's Watchword from Acts 26, the Apostle Paul stands before King Agrippa, and he provides a simple yet powerful statement of faith: *To this day I have had the help that comes from God, and so I stand here testifying both to small and great.* Years before, God had turned Paul's life upside down. He had once persecuted the early Christian

believers, but once Jesus appeared to him, he himself began to serve Jesus in humility. God called him to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to the outside world, to both "small and great."

Paul's life was not easy. God's call upon him and His presence in his life did not fix every problem or eliminate every struggle. In a way, actually, God's call on his life made his life *more* challenging. But it was also more rewarding. Because of how God intervened in his life, Paul came to see more deeply how God is truly the "Fount of Every Blessing" and how "to grace how great a debtor" he truly was.

As Christians in the twenty-first century, we, like the Apostle Paul two-thousand years ago, must still always ask, "How has God helped us?" He has helped us all in different ways, through family, friends, strangers, teachers, mentors, pastors and the encouragement of others in the family of faith. Coming up with our own list is a valuable spiritual exercise. As we do, then we are also called, like Paul, to testify to how God has helped us, to "raise our Ebenezer," in the hope that others might find in God the source and goal of their existence.

 - Thank you to all those that participated in making this year's 4th of July float a success! Our Theme was "We've got Spirit, the Holy Spirit!" If you missed it you can see it in the Sweet Corn Festival Parade!
 - Messy Games will be held Saturday, August 16th from 11:00am – 3:00pm. Youth are to wear old clothing and shoes and bring a towel. Lunch will be provided.
 - We will be showcasing our float in the Sweet Corn Festival on Wednesday, August 27th.
- 5. Outreach Ministry Daria Carr (Outreach Coordinator)
- VBS already working on next year's 2026 VBS.
- The Membership Committee met at the end of June and is now about halfway through the congregational listing. Reach outs will follow.
- Crochet Club resumed monthly in June with three new friends. Summer club started meeting weekly and also has a couple new attendees.
- America 250 A motion was made by Casey Sigler and seconded by Carl Lahman to participate in the national America 250 celebration commemorating the 250th anniversary of the United States. Motion passed. Grace will be part of the Village of Thornville committee to plan events throughout the year. Specific details about Thornville's plans are not yet available.
- **6. Upreach Ministry** Casey Sigler (Upreach Coordinator)
- Volunteers needed for Greeters, Lectors, Communion Assistants, and Acolytes. Thank you to all those that have signed up to volunteer!
- 7. Treasurer's Report Rick Rockwell (Treasurer)

- 8. Facilities Report Dave Rodenbaugh (Facilities Coordinator)
- Window shades in the parsonage were replaced.

- Door hinges and door latches on both Blessing Boxes were replaced with solid brass to prevent rusting of the brass plated hardware.
- Extended conduit and re-pulled longer wire to the new sign.
- Helped with the installation of the new sign on July 11.
- Removed dirt from around new sign and planted grass around sign and under the tree.
- Replaced HVAC damper motor to office as to work properly and not be so cold.
- With agreement of the local fire department, we will be replacing all of our rechargeable fire extinguishers. They need to be serviced every six years. Non rechargeable are good for twelve years. Seven were needed to be serviced this year, so they been (donation) replaced.

9. Continuing Business

- New Outdoor Sign
 - A new footer has been dug, prepped, and poured per engineering specifications. Time was needed to let the concrete cure and hardened before putting the new sign on it.
 - Installation of sign was finished on July 11th.
- Roof damage claim for hail damage
 - An engineering inspection was done by Haag Engineering on June 11, confirmed minor hail-related damage. However, the roofing shingles at both the church and parsonage did not exhibit hail-related damage. The granule loss, surface wear, and scuffing were attributed to long-term weathering, foot traffic, and maintenance-related aging. It was decided not to proceed with the claim.
- Constitution Review Update
 - The next step is for council to review and make any suggestions/revisions before making it available to congregation members for consideration before a possible vote at our annual fall congregational meeting. Council will discuss at the August meeting.
- Door Lock Replacements
 - Door locks have been upgraded and new keys were issued.
- Installing parking stops in the handicap parking spaces and their location

- Council decided to have the Sign Committee discuss whether we need parking blocks, and if so, where should they be placed.
- Resident parking violators on Sunday mornings
 - A friendly note has been put on non-member vehicles that typically use the parking lot on Sunday mornings. So far, the problem seems to be solved.
- NALC Convocation Delegates
 - Four delegates have been registered to the NALC Convocation representing Grace: Steve Carr, Kris Lamphere, Bob Reynolds, and Shane Rockey.

10. New Business:

- Paul Varner Scholarship
 - Rick Rockwell made a motion and Daria Carr seconded the motion to accept the four recommended recipients for this year's Paul Varner Scholarship: Josiah Hamilton, Emily O'Hara, Grant McCallum, and Josie Sigler. Motion passed.
- LifeWise Academy Lease Agreement
 - Council is in the process of reviewing a new LifeWise Academy Lease Agreement.
 - LifeWise starts Sept. 10, 2025 and ends Apr. 9, 2026.
- Nominating Committee
 - Council is starting to work on a list of potential people to serve on this committee. Three voting members are to serve on this committee, one of which is to be an outgoing council member.
 - This year we have two positions to be filled next year: President and Treasurer. Carl will be completing his first term and has decided not to run again for a second term. Rick will be completing his second term.




Summer vacation has gone much too fast! It's now time to think of resuming school, Adventures in Faith, and BELLS! It's time to get back to Grace Notes and ringing.





When we walked into the Tanzanian municipal office September 29, 2022 inquiring about adopting, we had no idea what God had in store for us. We trusted and took it one step at a time. This is something we have been doing when we have felt Him calling us to step out into the unknown and outside our comfort zone. There has been many times with just a mustard seed of faith (and at times even smaller) that we took that first step. Anyone who knows our story/life can testify to this.

It took over a year to collect all the appropriate documents to submit to the commissioner for his/her approval to be matched with a child. On February 6, 2024, we were handed the smallest, most precious, smiling girl that would forever change our lives. We then fostered Zawadi for 6 months.

After several hearings, a fake lawyer, change in judges...we walked into our hearing on April 9th not knowing what to expect. This is the day we have been praying and longing for, to add to our family. We thank God for "adoption" not only here on earth but in Heaven. If you don't know what we're talking about, we'd love to share it with you!!


